Transcultural collaboration in health challenges Bridging disciplines and cultures for innovative solutions

The elective module, organized for its first edition in Utrecht and Montpellier and titled "Tackling health challenges in internationally linked Research Hubs" offers a unique transnational and intercultural learning experience for master's students from CHARM-EU allied universities

The learning pathway is **structured in two parts**:

- a 13-weeks "dry part" focused on framing solutions 3 ects
- a 6-month "wet part" dedicated to hands-on research 30 ects



THE MODULE - Tackling health challenges in internationally linked Research Hubs

International Collaboration

Students form interdisciplinary teams with members from different partner universities and diverse academic backgrounds.

This cross-cultural interaction fosters a global perspective on health challenges and promotes mutual understanding among participants from various nationalities.

- All students work on the same urgent research health-related challenge.
- Each group has a supervisor (academics or PIs identified) a "connector" to put students in contact with experts (researchers, medical doctors, patients) from the UM and UU hubs, they could interview/consult.
- Students must produce a research proposal, pitch and reflection report.
- In all universities, the learning environment is offered by CHARM-EU (Hybrid Classrooms and Virtual Learning Environment)



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






Diverse speakers introduce their perspective on the topics to students.






The conference is open to all audinces and counted over 80 participants for its first edition.

Internships, offered to students participating in the modules, are assigned in September and hosted by partner universities. For the first edition, two internships are available in Montpellier and two in Utrecht, connected to projects overseen by principal investigators (PIs). Students are selected by their master's program coordinators.
