The Knowledge Creating Teams of CHARM-EU Master decided to organize **a cross-thematic Blended Intensive Program** for the students of CHARM's pilot master *Global Challenge for Sustainability*.

AN EXAMPLE OF INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION IN EDUCATION

This initiative aims to enhance the application of various CHARM-EU educational principles, particularly Challenge-based learning, Situated learning and Transdisciplinarity.



During the 12-day MOXMO, students address genuine sustainability challenges linked to Sustainable Development Goal 11: "Make cities inclusive, safe, resilient, and sustainable."

HYBRID ACTIVITY - REAL CHALLENGES

MoXMo starts with an **online preparation phase**, which includes a variety of activities such as literature research, team-building exercises, and pitch presentations aimed at preparing the challenged-based and student-led learning process.

This groundwork **equips participants with the necessary knowledge and skills** to confront challenges during the on-site period.

WEEK 1 - THAU LAGOON

- Visit of the lagoon for its global understanding.
- Workshops involving student's teams, teachers and local authority's referents.
- Autonomous visits to the local stakeholders organized by each student's team.
- Regular updates with both teachers and local authority's referents.
- Final global workshop with academic staff, student's teams, local authority's referents and a panel of local stakeholders.
