


Reviving the Cradle of Wine: Youth, Heritage, and Innovation in Georgian Viticulture

ETHICS


Several ethical considerations were taken into account:

- **Data Protection:** All data was stored on a password-protected device and deleted after the research was completed.
- **Confidentiality & Anonymity:** Participants' identities were kept confidential to allow them to share their views freely.
- **Informed Consent:** All participants were over 18 and provided consent for their data to be used.

The research used the Sustainable Livelihood Framework, which considers multiple 'capitals' and the surrounding governmental systems to provide the project context.



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
